Carol's Corner: It can start in your own yard!

Those hot purple berries are sure beautiful! Beautyberry (*Callicarpa americana*) is well a beautiful plant. It is a perfect shrub size, about 5-7 feet tall. It can be used for a back "fence" with a wonderful show of leaves, blooms and fruit. Beautyberry is deciduous so it starts in spring developing their large leaves on the stems of this multi-stem plant. Then in spring flowers starts developing from the bottom of each branch and work their way up to the top. That is such a treat to see them with buds on the top, flowers further down and berries turning pink near the base. The big grand finale is when all the branches are loaded with beautiful purple berries.





Beautyberry then drops it's leaves. Stunning to see branches with clumps of the berries. Beautyberry is drought tolerant, takes full sun to part sun and grows in zones 8-11. The berries also attracts birds. I love to have a Catbird come and munch on the berries. In late winter trim back the branches so the branches aren't sprawling and looking untidy. Great one for your yard.
