

Silk Grass

Isn't that a wonderful name?


It has several common names such as Silver-leaved aster, Grass-leaved golden-aster, Silky golden-aster and Narrowleaf silkgrass. The plants scientific name is (*Pityopsis graminifolia*). This plant is a robust perennial wildflower found in scrub, scrubby flatwoods and pine flatwoods throughout the state.




My front yard is in full sun and I just planted a few in the area.

One is already started to bloom in pretty yellow flowers. The family part of the plants name is *Asteraceae*, which is a large family of flowering plants that consists of over 32,000 known species. The family is commonly known as the aster, daisy, composite, or sunflower family. The leaves are so silky and shiny they almost look like grass. The leaves are covered in fine hairs, giving the leaves a silvery hue. The species *graminifolia* is from the Latin *gramen*, or "grass," and *folius*, or "leaf."

I do have a non-native plant growing in my garden that I love to eat! I mostly eat them in salads or straight off the plant. It is the wonderful cherry tomatoes! Currently they are blooming with pretty yellow flowers. The tomato (*Solanum lycopersicum*), is a plant whose fruit is an edible berry that is eaten as a vegetable.

Invitation to Participate in a Research Project

My name is Sonia Stephens, and I am an Associate Professor of English at the University of Central Florida. I'm writing to invite you to participate in a research project that I'm conducting to study how people use nature identification apps, which are tools whose main purpose is to help people identify species of plants, animals, or fungi. For example, this includes Audubon Bird Guide, iNaturalist, Merlin Bird ID, PlantSnap, and ShroomID, among others. I am looking for people to interview about how they use these apps to identify species, what role apps play in their nature observations, and what they like and dislike about these apps.

If you are interested in participating, the interview will take between 45-60 minutes, and it will be conducted using Zoom web conferencing software. You will be asked questions about your experiences using nature identification apps, how frequently you use them, what role they play in your nature observations, and what you like and dislike about these apps.

In order to participate, you will need to have access to a computer or tablet that can download Zoom.

If you are interested in participating, please reply to <u>sonia.stephens@ucf.edu</u> with the following information. I will follow up with a link to an online appointment calendar for scheduling an interview.

- Your name and preferred email address.
- What types of nature observations do you usually make? This could include birding/birdwatching, plant identification, herping, mushroom identification, or something else.
- Which nature identification apps do you use? Examples include Audubon Bird Guide, iNaturalist, Merlin Bird ID, PlantSnap, or ShroomID, but there are many others.

You must be 18 years of age or older and able to speak and read English to take part in this research study. You must also be someone who uses plant or animal identification apps when observing nature.
